

# CHILDREN IN SEA RESCUE DRAMA

**FIVE WEST youngsters described today how they rescued three people from drowning while on a day's outing to the seaside.**

The five, aged from 13 to 17, saved two women and a man from the sea at Porthcawl.

All the rescuers are members of Chippenham Amateur Swimming Club. Club president Mr David Chamberlain, of Providence Terrace, Chippenham, said today: "Ninety of us were on our annual club outing

back she started to panic. I saw Lesley Durham, another member of the club, near at hand and called to her to help me.

"Together we managed to pull the woman to the shore."

## 'Serious'

"Our youngsters were involved in two separate rescues. Three girls rescued a man and a woman from the surf. The woman was drowning and would have died if they had not gone to her aid.

"In the second rescue a boy and a girl from our club saved a woman who got into serious trouble in the water."

Thirteen-year-olds Alison Elms, of Westmead Lane, and Nicola Swan, of Dallas Road, who both attend Hardenhuish School, Chippenham, spoke today of the rescue.

"We were just out of our depth in the sea," said Alison. "We saw some people about 20 yards away shouting and calling for help.

## 'Panic'

"When we reached them the woman was beginning to panic and I got her to lie on her back. I brought her in 20 yards and then I saw Sandra Amor, another member of the club. She came over and we went the rest of the way to the shore with the woman together."

Nicola went to the man who had been shouting for help. "I grabbed hold of him and towed him in about 20 yards," she said. "A boy in a canoe helped me with him for the last 10 yards to the shore."

Alison and Nicola are undergoing instruction in lifesaving by Mr Chamberlain, who organises courses for the club.

"All our classes this year were made worthwhile," said Alison.

Sandra (14) is a pupil at the George Ward School, Melksham.

The second rescue involved Julian Webb (17), of Queen's Crescent, Chippenham, who has just left Hardenhuish School, and Lesley Durham (14), of Wood Lane, in the fourth-year at School.

They saved a woman who got into difficulties in the sea.

## 7ft waves

Julian said today: "I was out swimming when I heard a woman near me crying: 'I can't get back!' she said.

"I told her not to panic and started to help her back to the shore. The waves were 7ft. high. On the way
